



### Accelerated Math Pathway








# **Social Studies**

### (Reading Intervention, Support, Extension)

- VdM is committed to regularly analyzing site achievement data to provide a systematic approach for identifying and supporting at-risk students.
- A "Tiered System of Interventions" is in place to help meet the needs of academic, social-emotional, and behaviorally at-risk students on our campus.

- Opportunity for students to receive extra help, re-take tests, or make-up missing work.
- Opportunity for students to participate in an activity of their choice if they don't have missing work.



#### WEB is a yearlong transition program with four components that contribute to its success:

- Middle School Orientation WEB Leaders and 6th graders start building the mentor relationship and receive information about how to be successful in middle school
- Academic Follow Ups WEB Leaders support 6th grade academic success and character development through classroom visits
- **Social Follow Ups** WEB Leaders and 6th graders connect outside the classroom at social events to increase student engagement and promote positive school climate
- Leader Initiated Contacts WEB Leaders connect with their 6th graders on a more individual basis





# **AVID**

(Advancement via Individual Determination)

AVID is an elective focused on helping students become organized, confident, and successful in school and beyond.

Activities are focused on developing the following skills:

- Writing
- Inquiry and Critical Thinking
- Collaboration
- Organization
- Reading

Students also engage in goal-setting, field trips, and a weekly tutorial process where AVID students pay special attention to identifying points of confusion or curiosity in their classes and resolving them in small groups. Students who want to enroll in the AVID elective will need to fill out an application and interview.


